1. Introduction and Background

The NEARVET (Network of Excellence for Applied Research in vocational education and training) project aims at addressing challenges in vocational education and training by fostering applied research, innovation, and collaboration with companies, professional associations, research organisations to modernise its approaches and offer, and to stimulate continuous exchange and cooperation.

The NEARVET project (https://nearvet.projectlibrary.eu/) focuses on fostering the capacities and interaction among those actors in charge and able to systematically introduce and stimulate applied research in the VET contexts. It originates from the attempt to answer two founding questions: if Applied research is critical in VET, and to VET innovation, who are the applied researchers? What are their needs in terms of knowledge, capacities, methods and tools to play this critical role effectively?

Our vision is that Applied Research in VET, fostering high-level innovation in vocational education and training (VET) across Europe - happens in many different ways and contexts; it is implemented and driven by all VET actors – i.e. VET teachers, VET managers, employers and businesses, trade association and others acting as organisers and intermediaries; VET (including higher VET) students; researchers and that it does not occur in a vacuum, but rather in a diverse and interconnected environment where relations, interactions, cooperation and co-creation are possible and feasible¹.

We focus on strengthening ties between VET providers, SMEs, and the academic community to enhance the relevance and quality of VET. Through transnational cooperation and a Community of Practice approach, NEARVET seeks to create a European community of applied researchers in VET, promoting digital transformation,

innovative teaching, and closer connections between education and the labour market².

The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) serves as a common agreement to establish key areas of progress and cooperation that will extend beyond the project's duration.

It outlines the mutual understanding and agreement of the undersigning parties to continue supporting and expanding the NEARVET network and its outcomes. 2. Objective

The Memorandum of Understanding aims to strengthen the cooperation established during the NEARVET project by enhancing the capacities of VET actors and stakeholders to integrate applied research competencies, networks, and initiatives into their daily operations. It defines the areas of common interest that the parties wish to continue exploring and advancing beyond the project's end, ensuring the sustained impact of NEARVET's achievements.

The MoU formalizes the mutual understanding of the parties regarding their interest in and support for building upon the experience, achievements and outcomes of NEARVET. Notably, by doing so, this MoU establishes a framework that can build upon NEARVET with regards to enabling the growth of applied research in VET and fostering ongoing innovation in vocational education and training across Europe.



3. Strategies

Our mission was to develop a first step with reference to supporting the evolution of Applied Research in VET across Europe according to our NEARVET concept.

A Community of Practice was initiated amongst the NEARVET participations and a digital environment developed to provide resources and opportunities to support Applied Research in VET.

Therefore we, the Network of Excellence for Applied Research in Vocational Education and Training, pursue the following strategic aims:

Sustaining and developing the NEARVET Network Concept

- To ensure the continued operation and enhancement of the NEARVET network concept
- To promote the network's activities, outcomes, and benefits at national and EU levels that are consistent with our vision of applied research in VET.

Therefore we, the Network of Excellence for Applied Research in Vocational Education and Training, pursue the following strategic aims:

Sustaining and developing the NEARVET concept

- To ensure the continued operation and enhancement of the NEARVET concept.
- To promote the activities, outcomes, and benefits at national and EU levels.

Mainstreaming Applied Research Collaboration

- To Continue fostering collaboration in Applied Research between VET providers, private sector entities, and public institutions.
- To detect relevant innovative initiatives, knowledge and cases already happening in the European VET landscape in Applied research as specified in NEARVET and connect these with our engaged communities.

Enriching NEARVET Communities of Practice

- To Maintain and expand the NEARVET communities of practice by engaging new stakeholders and enhancing network reach and involvement.
- To Utilize the network's findings to address competence needs and develop effective applied research cases.

Maximizing Utilization of Project Results

- To Ensure the effective dissemination and application of NEARVET's results to maximize their impact.
- To Facilitate open access to resources and results to support ongoing research and development in VET.

Policy Dialogue and Integration



- To Engage in policy dialogue to integrate NEARVET recommendations into national and EU VET policies.
- To Advocate for the prioritization of research and innovation in VET within EU programs and policies.

4. Actions

The main actions are focussing on nurturing and expanding the NEARVET network on clear and focused objective and to assure the continued relevance and sustainability of the NEARVET results and outcomes, including through their maintenance and promotion within the European wider VET community.

The MoU focuses on the following achievements:

NEARVET Online Hub

The undersigning parties agree to maintain, develop and promote the hub with its main element – the online e-learning resources (MOOC) – beyond the project's duration. It is the space where the digital applied research community in Europe can connect and applied researchers in VET can gain the competences to drive applied research in their working context.

NEARVET Open Applied Research Resources Space

The undersigning parties agree to maintain and update the Open Applied Research Resources Space. The ongoing addition of sources, the encouragement of networking and promotion of (European) interconnection of users strengthens the relevance of the hub and its range. To this extent, it is being open to submissions from the new members of the NEARVET MoU.

NEARVET Communities of Practice

The undersigning parties agree to actively promote, use and refer to the communities of practice established in the project. The CoPs can be enlarged and can communicate through the NEARVET hub and are open for new members. The CoPs expertise shall be sustained through engagement in future action related to applied research in VET, may it be on local, national or European level.

The engagements described above are undertaken by the partnership for the years 2025 to 2027. An annual partnership review is planned within the Annual meeting planned.

5. Future Collaboration

We resolve with reference to the established cooperation in the transnational and local Communities of Practice to create channels for regular feedback and communication between the undersigning parties.

Specifically, the collaboration shall be realized through:

Annual Meeting in form of a moderated online meeting to identify common challenges, share evolved experiences and explore new synergies.



Bi-annual Updates on the activities related to the NEARVET network and its outcomes. These can be shared in various forms, including news release on the NERVET hub and on the organisations' homepages; participation in external events as NEARVET network; annual collaborative short reports to assess the network's impact, utilization of project results, and ongoing activities. This can be both, an internal activity and a published news.
